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## Middle America Stops the Amnesty Bill

The People of the United States rose up and defended their country!

In the second quarter of 2007, the United States came dangerously close to enacting a law that would have accelerated their balkanization. President Bush, along with Sens. Edward Kennedy and John McCain, had been hard at work lobbying for a comprehensive amnesty bill that would also greatly increase legal immigration into the States.

If this bill had passed, tens of millions of illegal immigrants would have qualified for legal residency with a “path to citizenship.” The Center for Immigration Studies estimated that these aliens would ultimately cost the U.S. taxpayer \$834 billion more in welfare and other government services than they would pay in taxes. More than 40 million foreign workers (and their dependents) could have received green cards over the next 20 years.

The racial and cultural implications for the U.S. would have been devastating. With the white population having declined to near two-thirds, and our birthrates already eclipsed by non-whites, this amnesty bill would have expedited that future day where whites become outnumbered and outvoted in our own country.

The defeat of this bill represents one of the most singular and remarkable events in modern American political history, providing an urgently needed reminder of the power that could yet be wielded by the people of these States. And this victory is the more astounding in that they achieved it *twice*—even when pundits were confidently predicting that passage was a “done deal.”

In early May, Sen. Kennedy claimed to have a majority necessary to pass the bill. A key test vote was scheduled for May 21—and the bill cleared this hurdle. Alarms sounded throughout the country. The people

responded! Talk radio was abuzz with discussions and debates. CofCC CEO Gordon Baum gave interviews in both local and national radio broadcasts opposing the bill. CofCC.org National Webmaster Kyle Rogers was interviewed on talk radio, in both friendly and hostile territory. The Capitol switchboard lit up. NumbersUSA reported over 750,000 faxes sent by their Web service in the month of May alone. The national media could not ignore what was clearly becoming a popular uprising.

Nor could many of the Senators, nearly one-third of whom had to look

to next year's election campaign. On June 7, the Senate held a key cloture vote, with 60 votes needed to end debate and move to a final vote. Just two weeks before, over 60 Senators were on record supporting the bill. Yet when the smoke cleared on this cloture vote, only 45 “yeas” were heard. A solid bloc of Southern Senators (only two excepted) stood up for America. The bill was dead!

Pat Buchanan sounded a celebratory note shared by all of us: “Last week, in one of the great uprisings of modern politics, Middle America rose up and body-slammed the national establishment.” It was a day to remember.

But the elitism of the current Commander-in-Chief, remained on full, ostentatious display. Informed of the bill's defeat during his trip to Bulgaria, Mr. Bush responded simply, “I'll see you at the signing.” The *Washington Times* observed that Mr. Bush was determined to pass an amnesty so that his presidency would have a “legacy.” And what a legacy! Repopulating his country with Third Worlders! Leaving a racial conglomeration that must lead to disunity, chaos and confusion, if not open race war! So Mr. Bush went to work.

## A Hired Gun in “New Mogadishu” A Mercenary's Experience in Post-Katrina New Orleans

When you first meet Charles Clifton, his soft-spoken manner is more than a bit disarming; standing over six feet tall, and weighing 220 pounds, minus his weapon and combat gear. He impressed me as the type of guy who could pull the arms off an opponent in a fight. A US Navy veteran and soldier of fortune, he now owns and operates a private security firm in Wyoming, performing what is termed, “critical infrastructure protection.” There's not much in the way of squalor or destitute non-combatants that Clifton hasn't seen, but what he encountered in post-Katrina New Orleans left him chilled—and with a warning for the rest of us.

Like most everyone, Charles watched weather reports with interest as Hurricane Katrina turned and delivered a nuclear-level knockout punch to New Orleans (NO). As soon as it was discovered that the government of NO had abandoned its post and fled, phone calls to hired guns began to ring all over the country. Answering the call from Black Ice Security (based in suburban Va.) to be a member of a hastily formed team, Charles packed his vehicle and drove to Houston, where he linked up with his unit.

His security team assessed the situation in NO and decided that it was only safe to enter the city during the day. They set up camp, a military general purpose “medium” tent, in Baton Rouge in a park directly across from the State Police headquarters, where they

returned every night before dark for the first five days.

On the sixth day, Charles changed hats and joined the teams from Blackwater security. He and several others were assigned to perform “close protection,” guarding a FEMA Disaster Management Team (DEMAT). The DEMAT team consisted of three doctors, a half dozen nurses, a few physician's assistants, a pharmacist, and three EMTs. The DEMAT unit, like MASH units of old, came self-contained, with two large tents, two box trucks with generators, medical supplies and a mobile field clinic.

He was in a combat zone and there was no mistaking it, “On one particular

# CONSERVATIVE UPRISING: CofCC 2007 National Conference

On Friday, June 1st, we began our national conference which was dedicated to the memory of Council activists Frances "Ma" Bell, Dennis Wheeler, and Rev. Ernest Felker. A.J. Barker and Bill Lord emceed the meeting.

After beginning with the singing of *Dixie*, led by South Carolinian Rev. Col. Robert Slimp, our first panel discussed "How to be an activist." The first speaker was Joel LeFevre, editor of the *Citizens Informer*, who discussed the illustrious history of our organization and the duty we share to that legacy. Next was Dr. William Carter, who discussed the successful demonstrations in South Carolina by the CofCC, dealing with the issue of the Confederate flag on the grounds of the State Capitol in Columbia. Then, Prof. Michael Terry of Michigan discussed their success in the 2006 election where race quotas were outlawed. Finally, South Carolina Council Chairman and national Webmaster Kyle Rogers discussed his chapter's success in forcing the legislature to deal with the illegal immigration crisis.

This panel was followed by Mr. Leonard Wilson, Esq. discussing Sen. Herman Talmadge of Georgia and his firm religious commitment to preserving our heritage, and also providing some comic relief.

Later, Rev. Col. Robert Slimp of South Carolina discussed the crisis White South Africans now face under Black rule, and what Americans must learn from their example. In his presentation, he brought with him a South African music video made in tribute to the famous Boer General Koos De La Rey. Rev. Slimp closed by discussing the hypocrisy of prominent politicians who support amnesty for illegals and sanctuary for oppressed non-White peoples, but turn a blind eye to our people over there who had their nation stolen from them by the Marxist government of Nelson Mandela.

Continuing on the topic of the "popular" culture's indifference to the suffering of innocent Whites, Lt. Lou Calabro (formerly of the San Francisco Police Department) discussed the media's reaction to the Zebra Killings of 1973-74. Of course, the media's commitment to law, order, justice, and the protection of the innocent stops where they may damage the pro-"civil rights" agenda.

We closed on Friday with live entertainment provided by the North Carolina bluegrass band Mel Jones & the Bag of Bones.

On Saturday morning, the first panel discussed our fight against the Left. The first speaker was Ted Jennings, discussing his experiences

as founder of the Victory of Vietnam. He was followed by a worldwide hero of free speech, Paul Fromm of Canada. Fromm, a victim of endless persecution by the socialist near-dictatorship in Canada, discussed all he has gone through in trying to awaken the people of his country to

Both Edwardses have had great successes in advancing our cause in their local venues, and James has made three recent appearances on CNN's *Paula Zahn Now*. Certainly in enemy territory, James Edwards has presented an intelligent and respectable case to the country on why it means so much to us to preserve our heritage.

After lunch and the raffle drawings, Jared Taylor of *American Renaissance* gave the keynote address on a wide variety of topics such as demographics

night, I heard the sounds of bullets passing over my head; they were high up, but it was obvious what they were. Most of the medical personnel and even many of the security force seemed unaware that shootouts were taking place not far from us."

Charles remained with the DEMAT team for a week, whereupon he was transferred to duty in Slidell, La, providing security for a FEMA Disaster Recovery Center (DRC). A DRC is essentially a cash disbursement center; where the ill-reputed cash cards were given out, along with wads of cash to over a thousand people a day.

As in all situations disbursing cash to essentially Third World recipients, not everybody was satisfied that what they were getting was enough, forcing Charles to "get physical" more than once. Charles noted that the scene was revealing just how spoiled "New Orleans welfare types are to having everything handed to them."

After four days, Charles was cycled out of his post, and returned to Baton Rouge, which, coincidentally, was the same day hurricane Rita hit Brownsville. He received orders to link up with a group of Blackwater operatives at the NO Saints training camp, located on the fringe of NO. The area had been taken over by FEMA as a logistics center.

Charles remained there eight days, listening to the sounds of sporadic gunfire echoing from NO. It was then that he began to see the comparison of NO to Mogadishu. "Hell, we're there to provide help, but all locals did was complain about us and shoot guns." He went on to say, "I wish I could say that I coined the term 'New Mogadishu' but I didn't; however, it certainly was appropriate to the situation."

"I remember the night I heard the radio transmissions from inside the Superdome. There were two or three NOPD officers trapped in the rafters of the dome. One thing that stands out was their report of what they were seeing, '... [I]f we make our presence known, they'll kill us.' We're up in the rafters here, there's lots of violent activity down below. ... [W]e'd like to help, but we're out-gunned.'" Charles shook his head and took a deep breath, "There were reports of rapes and beatings going on, but the police were unable to assist. It was Mogadishu all right."

His next assignment was more like something out of *Apocalypse Now* than Mogadishu. Charles was assigned to help rescue, of all things, a holy book belonging to an organization called the United Sikhs. He and three other security contractors, along with a representative of the Sikhs, boarded a boat and set off through the stinking brackish waters into the "heart of darkness," the notorious Ninth Ward.

As they quietly motored through the floodwaters, Charles could smell dead bodies and watched crazed dogs, which had, "... gone nuts from drinking the water." Like in the movie, *Apocalypse Now*, Charles met the hostile eyes of locals, standing on the embankments. On this assignment, Charles was armed with a combat shotgun, which he had to "show" to several locals, who seemed intent on interfering with his mission.



Upon arrival at the Sikh temple, which had miraculously escaped being vandalized, they marveled at its condition. Charles explained the lack of criminal damage as being the result of water being too deep for the average crack head.

The target of the rescue, the holy book, sat on a large table covered with carpet. A two hundred pound silver canopy, along with several swords, knives and candles also adorned the table. Strangely, watermarks on the walls clearly showed that the heavy table and all its contents had been lifted by flood waters almost three feet. Then, as the flood waters receded, settled directly back where it had been, without anything on the table getting wet.

The Sikh official was ecstatic about the pristine condition of the book. He pulled out his cell phone and notified his office. This set into motion a phone tree that quickly notified virtually every Sikh on Earth that their rare holy book had been saved.

The book and the accompanying artifacts were loaded into the rescue boat as Charles and his fellow mercenaries stood guard. Then as they powered back to the launch site, their boat was nearly swamped by a Marine amphibious vehicle. Upon their return, an old Sikh holy man who had waited with their vehicles, wept openly, joyous that their sacred relics had escaped the grabbing hands of looters that had stolen most everything of value in the entire city.

On day ten, Charles watched over the DEMAT team as they gave tetanus shots outside Oschner hospital. He

witnessed at least a hundred families staggering into the hospital, families with a condition he had never seen before—they were not only unable to take care of themselves, they were unwilling to do so. They were of all ages and wearing a wide variety of clothes, but one thing they all had in common was their race; they were all black.

He went on to describe them further, "Those people," Charles said, "... appeared to be in the low to lowest class of New Orleans citizens. The most common scenario

beyond me." He continued, "Strangely, some voiced angry complaints that the soldiers wouldn't accompany them home and unload their cars for them." He laughed and said, "I guess they wanted us to cut the damned MRE bags open for them too."

The whole scene made Charles angry, "God, the whole bottom half of the populace were very poor and dependent. They were so used to people holding their hands through their day-to-day life. The elderly blacks had social workers come by their houses once or twice a day to make sure they ate and took their meds. And what's worse, from the look of them, most of them could have taken care of themselves. It was like having a five-year-old and never bothering to potty train him." He scratched his head and said, "I've never seen anything like it in my life."

Charles then explained, "The cradle-to-grave social programs, where the local and state governments treated them like they were incapable of taking care of themselves screwed them up so bad that it removed any willingness on their part to even wipe their own behinds." It was obvious that what Charles had seen was a clear indictment on socialist programs. "As soon as Big Brother was gone, the people just sat around waiting to die."

As Charles mingled with various police officers and units from places as distant as Los Angeles and New York, he noticed how they regarded each other as brothers. But, as Charles quickly spotted, "What I didn't see was out-of-town cops eating with New Orleans cops." He continued, "The New Orleans cops I did see seemed ignorant; they had bad attitudes towards everybody. They wouldn't answer legitimate questions, and weren't willing to go out of their way to do anything for anybody. This made things unnecessarily difficult for out of town officers."

One of the primary questions was regarding local gang activity. Charles observed how tight lipped the NOPD cops were about gangs. "We couldn't get any info out of NOPD about them. It looked like the locals were protecting them." "But, to be fair," Charles said, "I did see a few NOPD officers who performed well; I think they may have been some of the few decent cops, along with the NOPD SWAT unit."

Charles heard many complaints about the response of the federal government to the crisis. He had a different take on things, "At the end of the day, the feds did a far better job than was ever reported. We passed convoys of supplies three miles long. I saw airboats racing around NO piloted by officers who had driven all night from Arizona to pitch in."

"Hell," Charles said, "by the time

we got to town there were hundreds of trucks full of drinking water. The air was full of helicopters. In Baton Rouge, there were 'copters landing every two minutes letting off people they had rescued off rooftops. I saw ambulances from everywhere. I even saw dog rescue units from Massachusetts."

Then there were the guys from NYC, "We ran into a group of New York fire-fighters, with their heavy equipment. These were

guy who had climbed into the Trade Center on September the eleventh." Charles described how the New Yorkers had driven straight through, wanting to go right to work, but instead met an obstacle they hadn't expected—the remaining New Orleans bureaucracy, "After doing only one patrol," Charles said, "they told me that they were directed to the French Quarter to be used as props waiting for politicians to pose in front of their vehicles for photo ops."

Charles pointed out a clear example of just how dysfunctional the local government was, "I drove across overpasses near the St. Bernard area, covered with survivors; but only the feds sent in vehicles to haul those

people out to safety." He continued, "It was like the city and state government wanted this to happen. The local officials were quick to blame Washington for inaction, but it was the local officials who sat on their asses pointing fingers. Aside from the local politicians getting in the way," he said, "the help was there; it was monumental."

He summed it up like this, "Once the government collapsed, some locals fell into dysfunction and the gangs fell back into tribes." He took a deep breath and continued, "My experiences caused me to think deeply about what this portends. The American people had better be prepared for the worst when a welfare state like New Mogadishu collapses. This one was relatively small. Just imagine what will happen if the government collapses from one end of the Gulf of Mexico to the other."

His last observations left this author chilled. **C**

We sincerely believe that, God-willing, Mr. Edwards is destined for an indispensable role in the leadership of this movement. Our prayers and support are with him. **C**

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


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

Since the South had held together, (with only Mel Martinez of Florida, and Lindsay Graham of South Carolina on the other side), Mr. Bush went in search of treachery south of the Mason-Dixon line. He found it in a man whose betrayal of Conservatives was felt personally by CofCC members, particularly in Mississippi, and will be long remembered. That man was Trent Lott, who not coincidentally is retiring and therefore immune from voter retaliation. We do not know why he decided to stab his constituents in the back this way. Perhaps we'll learn the reason after he leaves office—after we learn who he goes to work for. It is

one of many disappointments we have faced, to see a man who once stood on principle, who could have ended his days with honor revered by his people, but whose mediocre legacy will instead fade into ignominious reproach.

With Sen. Lott's help, the dinosaur was resurrected; the bill came back on the floor. And this time, it looked unstoppable. Supporters won a critical cloture vote on Tuesday, June 26, and with that loss for our side, it appeared our country's fate was sealed.

The bill's proponents revelled in the certainty of success, evidently believing that the people of the United States would be so demoralized after their previous victory had been stolen

from them, they would lose any spirit for further resistance.

But the people proved them wrong! If anything, *they became madder and more determined than ever.*

The next cloture vote was set for just two days later—only two days for the people to take their stand. On the Senate floor, Sen. Jeff Sessions reported that the phone calls coming in were so voluminous that the Capitol phone switchboard had crashed. Calls were overwhelmingly against the bill. E-mails and faxes blew into the Ten Miles Square. And Senators felt the heat.

When Thursday's vote was tallied, only 46 Senators could be found in favor of stopping debate and moving to a vote. Sixty were needed. The bill went down in flames yet again, and

this time it will likely remain dead until the next election is over.

But with this victory behind us, we must contend with the fact that thousands of unassimilable foreigners continue to pour into our country daily, under the massive immigration regime unleashed by the 1965 Immigration Reform Act—and thousands more Mestizos (and God knows who else) invade our country every day thanks to the refusal of the Federal government to secure our Southern border.

We must join together to protect our threatened ethno-culture and stop the invasion of these States by non-Western aliens. If you are not yet a member of the CofCC please turn to page 9 and join us in the fight to preserve our people and our country. **C**
